
Blood pressures are taken on the third Sunday of the month at 8:45 A.M. and 10:15 A.M. in the church fellowship hall.



## THE PARABLES OF LENT


A SERIES OF SERVICES for the SEASON OF LENT

Join us for The Parables of Lent, a special series of services for the season of Lent. Each service in this series focuses on a biblical parable that connects to Lenten themes.




Week Two in the series is based on the parable of the hidden treasure and the priceless pearl. In this parable, two men give all that they have to buy objects of great worth.

#### **Emergency Voters' Meeting**

March 15 after each service in the sanctuary. The agenda items will be the additional LCEF loan to cover the second phase of construction in St Johns' schools and the ensuing change to EEI's lease payments. Please see the included document detailing the amount of the second loan as well as the new lease amounts.

The new loan is smaller than anticipated two years ago because Eagle has chosen not to add new classrooms to St Johns' building, Instead of that large school model, they will continue with a small school with 270 students and are expanding into the school buildings at Emmaus and Messiah Lutheran where they will also operate small schools.

The projected lease rate of about \$1000/pupil per month will be reached in the 2015/16 school year even though Eagle will only have about 180 students while they reallocate students to their additional schools and continue to expand their overall program. As with the first loan, the payments EEI makes to the lease completely cover the monthly repayments of the two LCEF loans taken out in St Johns' name for the construction. EEI also funds an account with \$170,000/year for ongoing maintenance that includes anticipated long-term expenses like roof and elevator replacement so future construction costs will not impact St Johns' budget. After paying the loan, \$100,000 is left over in St Johns' budget each year.

#### EEI/ St Johns Phase 2 Proposed Financial Agreement

Phase 2 expansion of EAGLE Tower Grove South will include a \$1,000,000 renovation of the current school facility to accommodate 270 scholars K-8. Phase 2 construction will take place this spring and summer and will include renovations of the bowling alley (for computer lab, multipurpose and office space), stage, classrooms in Building B, AC installation in Building B, new parking lot, new windows in Building B, landscaping on Chippewa, et al. There will be no new expansion building as originally planned as we are no longer planning to serve 450 students. This will give us tighter community and maintain more parking spots on the property. This year EAGLE began with 210 scholars on campus; at full capacity we will serve only 60 more scholars when we are a full K-8 school. The lower enrollment has a direct impact on the funding for the facility, and for that reason the new payment schedule is proposed. Base Rent is paid by EEI to St Johns and includes loan payments and the surplus expressed below. EEI also pays for all the expenses to maintain the property per the lease agreement.

Moreover, EAGLE held its first lottery Feb 19<sup>th</sup>, with 80+ new enrollees. EAGLE Tower Grove South is fully enrolled for next year with an extensive waiting list, as we open up the next two schools in Fox Park. The move to the smaller school is to strengthen the community and utilize the facility in the best possible manner for the sake of our scholars. Thanks you for your support of EAGLE and Compass!
