Social Ministry Food Pantry Update

Hebrew 13:5, "I will never leave you nor forsake you."

How would you feel if you lost your job and had no food to feed your children? How would you feel if your food stamp allotment had been cut in half and your total income is \$400.00 a month? These are just a few of the stories told to us in the food pantry. Most of these same people still say they are blessed and are thankful to God for His care.

We serve on an average of 50 families a week. We are continually grateful to you for your assistance. May God continue to bless us with the food we need, through your generous gifts, so that we can keep our doors open to serve the community.

We are still getting acclimated to our new surroundings in the school. Clothes cannot be accepted until about the first of November, as we have no storage for them at the present time.

Herbal Remedies

This month I want to share some thoughts with you on Herbal Remedies and your Health. The Bible reminds us that God lovingly gave "...every green plant for food" (Gen. 1:30).

Today many people seek assistance to feel better and live fuller lives with chronic illnesses. Pharmacies have many herbal products, which can be taken without a Doctor's order. Many of these products are available as teas, tinctures (concentrated liquid) and tablets. You need to be sure that the product you buy is the pure form of the herb. Most of the medications we take are plant based. It is best to think of medications and herbs all as powerful drugs.

Before trying any herbal or other over the counter treatments a word of caution is in order. I strongly encourage you to visit with your Doctor. There are several strong interactions possible when we combine certain foods, herbs and medications. Studies have shown that grapefruit can make some drugs as estrogen, some heart and blood pressure medications more potent in the body. Ginkgo can increase the risk of bleeding for persons taking Coumadin.

In the same way we at St. Johns will come to the close of the church year, then advent and the coming of our Savior and a new year will begin.



ALL VOTERS PLEASE READ

During the September 13, 2015 Voter's meeting, it was motioned and seconded that we eliminate the debt on the loan we refer to as the Restoration Loan. In the next voters meeting this motion with be discussed and voted on. As you may or may not know we took out a loan to restore and improve our facilities. (Fellowship Hall, air conditioning, elevator, bathrooms, nursery, etc.)

Here are the facts after talking to Lutheran Church Extension Fund:

- Original loan taken out on December 20, 1993.
- The original loan amount was \$312,090.00
- As of August 2015, we have paid \$509,813 toward the repayment of that loan.
- Our monthly payments to LCEF are \$1,194 this will continue until the maturity date of 2026.
- The current balance on the loan is \$96,162.00 plus interest, which is at this time 3.875%. (It does change annually)

In addition it was also moved and seconded that we use our endowment money to pay it back.

You may or may not know that we have a fund called the endowment fund. As noted in our Constitution and By-Laws, typically the earnings from the fund are used for mission work of the congregation and for the general fund. Investments of the principal are the decision of the Endowment Fund Committee. (Eunice Bain, Debbie Schmidt, Alexis Bohannon) They then in return report back twice a year to the congregation. Withdrawing funds from the endowment principle should only be done in extreme circumstances upon recommendation of the Church Council and two-thirds majority of the Voters Assembly. The vote would take place at the next Voters meeting after the initial motion, November 1, 2015.

Here are the facts after talking to Alan Peterson, Advisor at WEDBUSH:

- The most recent statement, (8-31-15) there is a net worth of \$154,326.45
- It is accessible at this time.
- The interest we receive at this time is less that a 1%
- If said money is asked for by the voters (two-thirds majority) they would immediately send a check for the amount from the account.
- Pending the signatures on the WEDBUSH account, (President, Vice-President, Treasurer and a number of elected voting members) and a copy of the minutes from a voters meeting giving the go-ahead.
- None of the money taken out is taxable and
- There are no fees in connection with a withdrawal.

These are the facts to help you make an informed decision on this matter. Please prayerfully consider this issue and voice your opinion in our discussion and vote of this motion.
