

This month I want to focus on diabetes and how we can live healthier and fuller lives.

Diabetes Mellitus is a chronic disease, which affects our ability to produce and respond to insulin. This causes high levels of glucose (sugar) in the blood, which may cause complications ranging from blindness, kidneys and circulation problems and even death.

Take the Test...Know your risk!

Read the following statements, and if they are true for you give yourself 30 points. If the statements are not true add a 0. The higher your score, the greater your risk is for diabetes. If you have specific concerns, please see your Doctor. You need a blood test to know for certain if you have diabetes.

- 6. I have a parent with diabetes.....
- 7. I have a brother or sister with diabetes.....
