


Debts Paid in Full!

One of the many moments of celebration come when a debt is paid off. Whether it is a car or home or any other financial obligation. It's as though a huge weight has been taken off your shoulders. All four of my boys feel the weight of their student loans, not being able to live by what is reflected in their paychecks but according to their debts. Some have waited several years from starting a family, buying a house or moving closer to family. I still remember when I paid off my car, the payment was taken out of my account automatically, so when I got the notice I almost forgot I had a monthly debt, I was free or some of money

was freed up to do other things with it.

Well, we here at St. Johns Lutheran Church have received notice that our debt has been paid in full. You may not know that every month since 2006 we were paying \$1,193.96. for



a loan that we originally took out in December, 1993 for \$312,090.00. Some leaders had the foresight of making some changes for the future of our congregation. Both for the comfort and safety of the members, children in school, and visitors. I can't find in our records all that was done, with the loan and grants but a few of the items we still enjoy today are a renovated fellowship hall, air-conditioning, heating, an elevator, restrooms, nursery, repairs, painting, maintenance, preservation and



Since the beginning of our Evangelism Ministry, prayer has been an essential part of all aspects of what we're about.

Two important outreach opportunities are based upon prayer--Prayer Warriors and the Prayer Chain.

Prayer Warriors are folks who pray (in their homes) for requests, which are mailed to them once each month. If you are unable to attend worship at church, this is an excellent way for you or anyone to join fellow members in praying for special needs.

The Prayer Chain is comprised of members who are willing and available on a daily basis to receive prayer requests and pass them on to the next person on their chain. They are asked to pray for the

specific prayers that they receive and then continue the "chain" by sending the requests on. (Prayers are not sent every day, but as needed.)

Stewardship

Christ died for our sins, was buried, and rose again. If you believe this gospel, if you stand upon it, and cling to it, you are saved. Trust in this is the dividing line. It defines, either positively or negatively, all men. It separates and divides Cain from Abel, Job from his so-called friends, Abraham from Abimelech, Isaac from Ishmael, Jacob from Esau, David from Saul, Daniel from Belshazzar, Joseph from Herod, Lazarus from the rich man, and the tax collector from the Pharisee. What defines men is not whether they are good or bad, but whether or not they believe in Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins.

The problem with man is his heart. Our hearts are fallen and predisposed to think that we can impress God. We think that if we do all the right things God will rewards us, and we will escape evil. We think that God will be impressed with our gifts, that our prosperity and goodness is evidence that God loves us or that it should motivate God to love us.

But we know better because God has blessed us with the faith of Abel, Job, and Abraham. We know that God's grace in Christ saves us, not our works.

We know that God is not impressed with our giving. He is not impressed when we give him that which is already his. God doesn't benefit from our giving and He doesn't need it. But our neighbor does need it. And God delights in us growing more and more like Him. He blesses us, and He invites us to bless one another with our giving: so that the Gospel may be proclaimed, so that the poor may be fed, so that all God's work through the Church may be done.

So consider God's priorities in comparison to your own. And be honest. Reevaluate where you are and where God has called you to be. Look into your own bank statement. Would any accountant think that the Church was your priority? He would see a spreadsheet filled with where your money actually goes: into house and clothing and cars, into eating out and beauty supplies and entertainment. Indeed, much of it wasted on frivolous things. But would he find great percentages going to the church? Figure up the percentage. Put it in relation to the proportion of your income. What percentage of your income do you give for the mission of the church: the preaching and teaching, the baptizing and communing, the help for the weak and poor brothers of Christ? Is it even enough for a deduction when you file your income taxes? The widow gave all she had and thought nothing of it. She was glad to do it. The rich man gave what to him was meaningless, trifle amount and desired a plaque in his honor. Why is it that the less we give the prouder we are and the more credit we expect?

All your works, even your monetary gifts, done in faith please God now for Christ's sake. No matter how great or small, frequent or infrequent. They are all washed and cleansed by grace through faith on account of Christ. Whatever you do from faith in God pleases him for the sake of the Son. So reevaluate your generosity in the light of the grace of Christ. Freely you have received, freely give.

Flu (Influenza) / Vaccine

THE FLU IS A SERIOUS DISEASE. Fortunately, there's something you can do to help protect yourself and your loved ones-ask your pharmacist or healthcare provider if a flu vaccine is right for you and your family.

WHAT IS THE FLU VACCINE?

The flu vaccine helps to protect you from the flu by introducing your immune system to the killed or weakened flu viruses that are predicted to be most common in a given year. The viruses that are selected for the flu vaccine each year are chosen depending on which strains are circulating, how they are spreading, and how well current vaccine strains help to protect against newly identified strains. What you may not know is that for the 2016-2017season you have a choice when it comes to getting a flu vaccine: a 3-strain flu vaccine or a 4-strain vaccine (adult vaccine). The 3 strain vaccine covers two type-A viruses and one type-B virus. The 4 strain vaccine may offer broader coverage from the flu by covering two type-A viruses and two type-B viruses. ASK YOUR PHARMACIST OR HEALTH CARE PROVIDER IF A 4 STRAIN FLU VACCINE IS RIGHT FOR YOU AND YOUR FAMILY.

You cannot catch the flu from the flu vaccine. The flu vaccines that are given by needle are made with viruses that are killed or virus proteins that are artificially made.

Some people experience mild side effects after getting the flu vaccine, which may include:

soreness or redness, or swelling where the vaccine was given; fever (low grade); aches and nausea.

Those who shouldn't get the vaccine include: children younger than 6 months of age or children younger than the age for which the vaccine is approved. (Approved age ranges vary by vaccine); people who have had a severe allergic reaction to a flu vaccine in the past or people with egg allergies.

Influenza can occur at any time, but most influenza occurs from October through May. Getting the vaccine as soon as it is available can help protect you in the event flu season comes early in a particular year. Once you get vaccinated, it takes about two weeks for protection to develop. The CDC recommends that you get a flu vaccine every year.
