A Gift in a Letter:

Before I tell you about it, I want to ask: What do we do with a gift? Well, humanly speaking we take them for granted, spend it, or we use it just on us, some are easy because we know what it is for, and sometimes we think we were entitled to it and assume it's all for us. "After all they have much we have little." (we reason) That kind of thinking gets us in trouble - spiritually. The letter I opened recently was accompanied with a check from someone I don't know,

One, we give thanks to the Lord,

Two, be a blessing to others by giving some of it away,


Three, invest or save part of it for some time in the future and

What I'll do is pray you take it to heart these stewardship principles seriously.

Social Ministry

As 2020 has approached, we are certainly looking back to 2019 and thanking God for all of our blessings.

Christ Memorial Church provided us with Christmas gifts to give out at the food pantry with an abundance of presents and gift cards. Thanks to all of our regular food pantry staff for their assistance in the distribution of the presents, for other members who helped, and for keeping the food pantry running smoothly. We also want to thank all of you who provided gifts for the "Giving Tree".

Our St. Johns Lutheran Church, other Lutheran churches, Eagle prep. Schools, Girl Scouts, Thrivent Insurance Co., and CPH have been so supportive of our food pantry that we are once again finishing the year with grateful hearts and funds to continue through the new year. We average serving 40 families a week in the food pantry. Our last quarterly report from 2019 revealed we served over 500 families, and a total of about 1400 people.

Thanks also to all of our members who contributed to the Thanksgiving food drive, and especially the members who assisted in sorting and putting away all the food we received. Karen Vineyard will co-chair with Maureen Rehmer in serving the daily activities of the food pantry. Karen will handle the food and bills and Maureen will take care of the other aspects of Social Ministry.

The food pantry will again be closed on the 5th Saturday's of the month in 2020, which is February, May, August, and October. Food pantry will also be closed on July 4th, November 28th, and December 26th.

Ripe for Harvest

One of the things I love about living in Costa Rica is the abundance of tropical fruit available in every season. Equal to the joy of cutting into a perfect mango or watermelon, however, is the disappointment of realizing that the pineapple or avocado you just bought isn't yet ripe. The reality is that **ripeness can't be forced or brought about by our own efforts**, and I think the same holds true when talking about the fruit that we see in ministry.


As a missionary, I naturally want to see the fruit of my labor in terms of lives changed and hearts receiving the Gospel, but ultimately the timetable of such a harvest isn't up to me. The growth and change can be slow, especially in a culture like Costa Rica's where nothing happens quickly. It is God alone who knows when a person's heart is ripe to accept the life-changing news of salvation, and it is His Spirit who creates the growth and a heart of faith.

So what's my role? As I walk in relationship with those around me - the neighbors I see and converse with every day, the teens of Esterillos that I hang out with weekly, the friend who's been studying English with me this past year, and the youth of Parrita that I've known for almost a year and a half - I'm called to trust in God's work and timing while putting myself in position to participate in the harvest when the time comes. I'm called to love them and proclaim God's love to them. I'm called to test their "ripeness" with questions and invitations and challenges. And most of all, I'm called to open my eyes to the ways in which God is already at work in their hearts and lives.

For Jesus is on a mission here in Esterillos and Parrita (he has been long before I arrived), and he has invited me to join him on *his* mission of redemption!


