As we go through life, striving to live out our calling as God's people, we will hit obstacles and face tests to our faith and to how we live that faith. God can work through these tests to draw us closer to Him. On the other hand, Satan wants to lure and entice us away from the path God would have us walk.

#### **OPENING SENTENCES**

### CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

God's Word reminds us that when we were slaves of sin, we were not free in regard to righteousness.

But now that we have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit we get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Let us confess our sins to God, who has brought us out of slavery and promises to lead us to the promised land of heaven.
