AS WE GATHER

Our thoughts are on the meal we call the Lord's Supper rooted in the Passover meal. "Remember this day in which you came out from Egypt, out of the house of slavery, for by a strong hand the Lord brought you out from this place. No leavened bread shall be eaten... And when the Lord brings you into the land of the Canaanites, which he swore to your fathers to give you, a land flowing with milk and honey, ... Seven days you shall eat unleavened bread, and on the seventh day there shall be a feast to the Lord... You shall tell your son on that day, 'It is because of what the Lord did for me when I came out of Egypt.' These were the words given to Moses by God to say to the Israelites on their way of being delivered out of slavery.

In this context Jesus chose to become the Passover lamb. His blood marked the wooden cross and His body? Well - would be eaten. Here is how Jesus put it. "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." John 6:51
