

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

As we prepare for the advent of Christ's coming John the Baptist asks "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" Jesus gives him an answer that gives him comfort. I am the one whom the prophet Isaiah spoke of. There is joy for the Christian that Christ is the one who has come. The love God showed us by sending His son, gives us joy to rejoice in His presence and the peace Jesus establishes between us and God gives us such comfort. The candles on the Advent wreath have often symbolized **hope**, **love**, **joy and peace**. All which are centered on Christ the Light of the World. (*Three Advent candles are lit.* 2 *Blue*, 1 *Pink*)

O Lord, You are the light that shines in all the darkness of our lives. As we wait, watch, hope, and pray, guide us all to reflect Your light and let it shine; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Let us now make confession of our sins to God, our heavenly Father. Merciful Father, our Lord and King, we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed. When we question your indwelling presence. When we have left undone those things we ought to have done; we have done those things we ought not to have done.

We have not always made Your kingdom of first importance in our lives. We sincerely repent of our sins and humbly ask Your grace and forgiveness in Jesus Christ. To those who believe in Jesus Christ He gives the power to become the children of God and bestows on them the Holy Spirit. NICENE CREED
